\$100K Prize for Best New Business Idea

The winner gets \$100,000 in seed money, along with a rent-free retail space in New York City for one year. Microsoft is using the contest to entice small businesses to sign up for its new Microsoft Office Accounting 2007 suite of software for small businesses, and the online entry form is full of pop-up ads suggesting applicants download the software. ❖

Big Idea Hunt – Cordless Phone

Thomson, a major producer of consumer electronics, is seeking innovations in cordless residential phones. They're looking for new features, functionality, even technologies to address "pain points" for current cordless phone users. Innovations will offer greater simplicity, convenience, functionality, comfort, customization, value, and/or stylishness. **Deadline for the Hunt is January 9, 2007.**

Ideally, new concepts could be added to existing Thomson products or new brands. Products should be appropriate for marketing throughout North America, mainly in mass merchandise, consumer electronics, and big box retailers, and sell for \$9.99 - \$129.99.

Current cordless products have a number of shortcomings including: disappointing battery performance, uncomfortable handset, inaccessible information, poor readability, inelegant user interface, overly complex, unsatisfactory sound quality, unreliable connections, poor range and poor reception.

Examples of innovations in cordless phones that are on par to what Thomson seeks:

- Cordless handset speakerphone: Thomson migrated this feature of digital phones to analog units.
- Cell Fusion: a product that allows your cell phone to connect to your home telephone through Bluetooth® technology, in order to access your cellular service through your home phone from anywhere in the house.
- Downloadable ring tones and wallpaper: Another digital feature that Thomson brought to analog phones.

FAU Creates Fund to Help Get Inventions to Market

The program addresses the gap between research and business development. To ease the transition from the laboratory to the consumer, Florida Atlantic University created a fund-raising program to promote the commercialization of its inventions.

The University of Florida and Florida State University have similar fund-raising programs aimed at producing products, services, and startup companies or attracting other research dollars for their inventions.

FAU researchers and students will compete for the new money by submitting projects and evidence of commercial viability to a committee of business leaders and FAU faculty. Initial awards are limited to \$15K with the first announcements coming in January. A handful of projects are poised to receive funding including a cancer therapy drug, and a generator that will be placed in the Gulf Stream to produce electricity. ❖

Potable Water Distillation Invention

Two Florida Atlantic University students, **Eikei Martinson** and **Brandon Moore**, hope that their invention will bring low-cost drinking water to Third World countries and south Florida. Martinson and Moore spent nearly two years turning a Boca Raton inventor's sketch into a desalinization machine that uses the vacuum created at the end of a 33-foot column of water to boil it at room temperature. The steam created from the boiling water is threaded into a condenser to create potable water.

The invention, a finalist in the October Collegiate Inventors Competition in Washington D.C., has attracted the attention of Florida Power & Light Company and Covanta Energy, a New Jersey company that turns trash into energy. ❖
